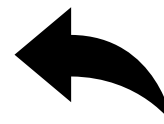

Notes from Meeting of 10 November: Tom Phillips



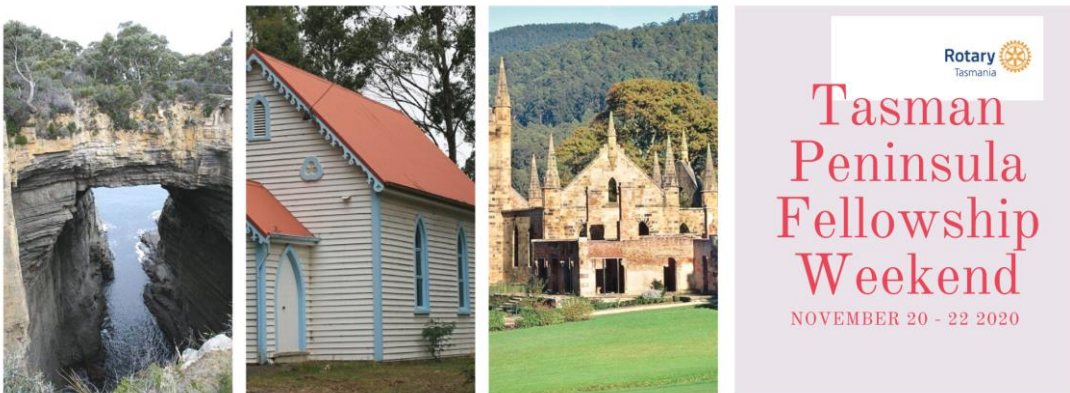
Our speaker was Tom Phillips, a mechanical engineer who serves as Statutory Engineer at Nyrstar's Derwent Park plant.

Tom graduated from UTAS in 2008 just in time for the GFC, and it took 18 months until he was able to obtain his first position at One Steel in Whyalla, where he met his future wife, Shylea. Whyalla was followed by a stint with MMG at Rosebery, where he and Shylea married in 2016, a transfer to Melbourne, redeployment as a FIFO mining engineer based in Townsville, and a new position at Temco Bell Bay just in time for an "operational review". Tom took up his current position in Hobart in July 2019.

Tom's role as Statutory Engineer involves compliance and risk mitigation functions, ensuring that engineering works and equipment are safe and fit-for-purpose.
